It Can Happen to You: Flash Floods

In light of the devastating flash flood that inundated Ellicott City, and with the 2016 hurricane season soon to reach its peak, we want to share some important information concerning flooding.



Floods can develop slowly or instantly. Flash floods develop in minutes and with no visible sign of rain. Flash floods often contain a dangerous

wall of roaring water that carries rocks, mud, and debris. This wall of water can sweep away most things in its path. Overland flooding occurs outside a defined river or stream, such as when a levee is breached.

Be aware of flood hazards no matter where you live, but especially if you live in a low-lying area near water or downstream from a dam. Even small streams, gullies, creeks, culverts, dry streambeds, or low-lying ground that appears harmless in dry weather can flood.

Below is a short listing of loss control measures to prevent and/or reduce flood losses:

- Building sites should be carefully evaluated for flood potential.
- Existing structures in flood zones should be analyzed for their ability to withstand normally expected events.
- Flood shields or barriers, use of temporary diking (or landscaping that incorporates diking features), shutters for building openings, and sandbagging (plan sandbagging layout before flood situation) should be provided.
- Emergency supplies should be kept on hand, portable power equipment to maintain vital utility services should be available, and main electrical service equipment should be placed on upper floors of buildings away from historical flood stage heights.
- Personnel should be assigned to implement emergency action plans, such as installing barriers and operating pumps, repairing damage, and disconnecting utility services.
- Salvage should begin as soon as possible and facility protection systems (i.e. sprinkler, fire alarm/detection systems and burglar alarms) and building systems should be restored as soon as possible.

FREE Cyber and Drone Coverages

What do cyber and drones have in common? They are FREE! That is, our coverages are free! If you still haven't taken advantage of these free products, it's not too late. Let me explain.

Cyber Insurance Program. LGIT offers the Cyber Insurance Program for free. This is a very important coverage. It provides a limit of \$1 million for:

- Privacy Liability for allegations of privacy injury
- Media Liability such as libel, slander, defamation, arising from use of social media.
- Data Breach and Crisis Management Cost for the cost to notify the public of a potential breach of personal identifiable information, Credit Monitoring Services, IT Forensics and PR Expenses (notification is mandated by Maryland law)
- Cyber Extortion
- Regulatory Defense, Awards and Fines
- Payment Card Industry (PCI) Fines with a sublimit of \$500,000

Additionally, you will have access to cyber loss control information at the CyberRiskIQ link as well.

Drone Insurance Coverage is our second free product. Recently the FAA issued Part 107 for small drones. This rule reduces prior restrictions and costs by regulating only a remote pilot certificate, and not a full pilot's license, to operate drones. We provide a property limit of \$2,500 automatically and a liability limit of \$1 million included in your Primary Liability policy subject to completing the Drone Application at this link <http://www.lgit.org/index.aspx?nid=749>.

Note that while the new rule does not address privacy issues, the FAA will provide all users with privacy guidelines as part of either the UAS registration process or the remote pilot certification process. The information can also be obtained through the FAA's B4UFLy mobile app. Finally, the FAA link regarding Part 107 for drone use includes a privacy best practices PDF link at the bottom at https://www.faa.gov/news/fact_sheets/news_story.cfm?newsId=20516.

Question: A local government is contemplating restructuring an employment contract. Can the local government unilaterally take away an employee's accrued leave?

Answer: NO. Under Maryland law, accrued leave is considered a benefit to the employee and the employer is not at liberty to unilaterally take it away.
